Four HPS members were singled out and recognized during the American Philatelic Society's annual meeting at Stampshow in Columbus, Ohio.

Greg Cain was recognized as a 25 year member of the APS. He was awarded his pin by Trish Kaufmann, chair of the APS Board of Vice Presidents and Greg Galletti, who stepped in for Robert Zeigler, APS president, who could not attend the show.

Ron Strawser was awarded the Nicholas G. Carter Volunteer Recognition Award for his years of service to Texas philately. The Carter Award recognizes the outstanding efforts of volunteers at national and local levels. The award was named in memory of past APS president Nick Carter who helped to establish them.

Denise Stotts was named one of three Luff Award winners by the APS for 2018. The Luff Award is the highest honor that can be bestowed on a philatelist in the United States and Denise received her award for Exceptional Contributions to Philately. Her many accomplishments were listed in the last issue of *The Perforator*. Denise signed the APS' Luff Scroll and received a ring to commemorate the occasion.

Rick Barrett received a Gold Medal in the Literature Competition for his new book, *Buffalo Cinderellas*, his first publication.

Bryant Korn wins Greater Houston Stamp Show 2018 Grand

HPS member Bryant Korn earned his first GHSS Grand Award this year with a showing of Liberian material and last year's Reserve Grand winner, Tommy C. Sim, MD repeated the feat again year. Nationally prominent stamp dealer Doug Weisz won the Single Frame Grand Award with a brand new exhibit, *New Orleans in the Confederate Mail System* and David Willig was the coveted Single Frame color competition winner.

Topper & Chaiet Represent HPS

On July 26th, there was a "2nd Day" (as opposed to a 1st day ceremony) stamp unveiling of the Mister Rogers Forever stamp at the Houston Children's Museum. Just a few days before the event, I was asked if I could set up a table and give free stamps to kids. Ralph Chaiet had a lot of the GHSS' Beginner's Booth material so I called him to help out.

There was a good turn out of 100's and 100's of kids and their parents. We gave out three and a half boxes of freebies to kids, their parents, and many of the postal workers who were part of the program (20+ people) and were also fascinated with the stamp puzzles, old FDC's, souvenir sheets and postcards. We had a handout available explaining our club and our upcoming show.

HPS is now on this museum's list as a contact point, should there be any other events with tiein's to philately.

An Early Dane in Early Houston

Among the earliest Danes to settle in Houston was John H. Repsdorph (Anglicized from Johan Henrik Roepsdorff). Born in Fredericia in 1835, he emigrated to the US and in 1873 married a fellow Dane and recent widow, Laura Amalie Strombom Wellejus, in Chicago. He worked briefly as a policeman and railroad passenger agent in Chicago but soon headed south to the fledgling city of Houston (around 16,000 population at the time) and in 1878 established the Repsdorph Company which manufactured tents, awnings, tarpaulins, etc.

He set up shop in downtown Houston, on Main Street just two blocks from Buffalo Bayou. The business was large enough to rent out two storefronts, at 110-112 Main, in the still standing Raphael Building.



Repsdorph also lived in the block, just a couple of doors down. Over the years the company moved locations frequently, ultimately winding up at 402-404 Capitol.

The founder died in 1892 and is buried in Glenwood Cemetery. But the company stayed in the family. In fact, his son Bernhard led the company into the 1930s; it may well have been a casualty of the Great Depression.
