FAM 14 to Brunei, a Conundrum

The cover illustrated was flown to Manila with the noted postal markings (see Table 1). The cover departed New York City on December 16, 1936 with a Foreign Mail Branch Duplex cancellation to Manila via San Francisco. Due to FMB designation, no transit marking was required at San Francisco. It was flown by United Airlines to Frisco, then by Pan American to Manila, Philippines. Looking at Table 2, notice the overflight of Guam. This was not an oversight, but a necessity due to a storm.

Regular airmail service was not available at the time from Kuala Lumpur or Brunei. Thus arises the question: how did this cover get from Manila to Kuala Lumpur, a distance of 1540 miles, about 12 days later? Then onward to Brunei a week later, going a distance of 931 miles by which ship? It continued on to Kuala Belait, a distance of about 60 miles.

Cleveland Rock and Roll Hall of Fame has 30 "Stamp Stars"

Cleveland, Ohio, the home of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, celebrated the 25th anniversary of the dedication of its home on the shores of Lake Erie during Garfield-Perry's March Party stamp show in Cleveland in early March.

Garfield-Perry is Cleveland's premier stamp club and their annual 3-day show is called March Party, dating back to the old days when the show was held near St. Patrick's Day.

The show typically celebrates a significant Ohio or Cleveland anniversary with a cachet and a commemorative United States Postal Service cancel. Sales are enhanced when related stamps are used to frank the cacheted envelopes rather than just the typical new definitive stamp.


So the hunt was on for Rock and roll Hall of Fame inductees who also graced U.S. postage stamps with their images. A couple of stamps were obvious choices such as the Elvis stamps and the Jimi Hendrix forever stamp, but we were pleasantly surprised when 30 different subjects turned up on the lists of both the Hall of Fame inductees and those on U.S. stamps.

The Hall of Fame inducts performers, but also has a category called "Early Influencers" and that category added significantly to the number of stamp honorees available. Sixteen of those on the list shown on the next page are in the Hall of Fame based on this category.

So Gospel, Jazz, Bluegrass, Country and other earlier forms of music with their key contributors grace both the Hall of Fame List and our U.S. stamp collections.

It is interesting to compare the dates inducted with the date of issue of the stamps and leads one to wonder if the fact that some were already in the Hall of Fame influenced the Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee when they were considering stamp subjects or vice versa.

The Aussie Study Group met on Saturday morning, Feb. 8. Two first-time attendees, Ed Christensen and Dick Moiel met with regulars John Germann, Larry Ballantyne and Jay and Denise Stotts.

The four regulars filled the first-timers in on what specialties within Australia they collect. John Germann showed some new cover acquisitions from his specialty, the bantam stamps of South Australia and Victoria.

Jay Stotts showed the first three miniature sheets issued by the Australian National Parks and Wildlife Service to support Koala research. The sheets contain "stamps" with different face values. The proceeds from the sale of these stamps go toward wildlife research.
