Greater Houston Stamp Show Is Just Around the Corner

We are currently in the middle of making preparations for our annual show, the Greater Houston Stamp Show. It is the most significant public philatelic event of the year within a geographic area bounded by Phoenix, Denver, St. Louis and Orlando. You would have to make a significant travel commitment to enjoy a larger show, yet it's right here in your own back yard.

So what makes the show so special? First, a few details: <u>Location</u>: Our 21st consecutive year at the Humble Civic Center, 8233 Will Clayton Parkway, Humble. <u>Dates</u>: Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Sep. 21-22-23. <u>Times</u>: 10 AM to 6 PM on Friday and Sat., 10 AM to 4 PM on Sun. Parking and Admission: They're FREE.

<u>Set-Up Day</u>: Set-up day (Thursday, September 20th) is extremely important for us because at 10am on Friday morning we open to the public. We would love to have as many HPS members as possible because the list of tasks includes setting up the exhibit frames, mounting mail-in exhibits, making final room arrangements for the dealer booths and assisting with their move-in and set-up for the Beginners' Booth. We usually work between 1 PM and 6 PM. Show Chairman Ron Strawser has a sign-up sheet for volunteers that is circulated at each club meeting.

<u>Exhibits</u>: We are now in our fourteenth year of our the single-frame color competition. The GHSS single-frame exhibit is one of the best, if not the best in the country because it attracts exhibits from all over the United States. You will see a strong showing this year of Purple themed exhibits. The multi-frame competition typically attracts national level Gold Medal exhibits. Show visitors are encouraged to vote for their favorite exhibit by using the ballot enclosed in the show program. The exhibit getting the most votes by the end of Saturday will win the People's Choice Award.

Dealer Bourse: A list of GHSS 2018 scheduled dealers is shown at the right. We hope you have plenty of great finds from our dealers and please take a moment to thank them for attending GHSS when you shop with them. The names of new dealers added this year are shaded.

Food Concession: We firmly believe that having an on-site food concession is a key to supporting both our dealers and show attendees. The show is an all day experience and staying on the premises for lunch allows more time for shopping, attending our meetings or seminars and provide a great opportunity to talk stamps over lunch with friends.

We will need a few club members to help man the booth throughout the day each day, so consider volunteering for this station.

Seminars and Meetings: Speaking of meetings, Saturday has a full compliment of meetings and seminars. The complete list will be printed in the show program, so consult it for planned meetings.

<u>Awards Banquet</u>: The highlight of the show is our annual Awards Banquet. The dinner is a catered barbeque buffet. Ticket costs are modest (\$20, and subsidized by the club). The caterer will again be Papa's Bar-B-Q and will feature brisket, sausage, chicken, potato salad, beans, cole slaw, spicy rice, peach cobbler and pecan pie. We have capacity for up to 50 and usually come close to selling out, so contact Denise Stotts to reserve your spots.

After dinner, the festivities start with a fun quiz based on Texas trivia and U.S. Purple stamps. We play until we have given out \$100 in cash, \$5 at a time.

The Exhibit award winners are recognized during the Awards Ceremony. The big awards this year will be our Grand Award, Reserve Grand Award, Single Frame Grand Award and the Purple Single Frame Award.

We conclude the evening with the ceremony to determine the single frame color for next year. Our three APS accredited judges and three others picked at random from the audience will assist with the unique and entertaining ceremony.

<u>Sunday</u>: There's still plenty of shopping opportunities on Sunday at the bourse. Sunday is especially nice because it's very relaxed day compared to the hectic pace of the previous three days.

When the show closes at 4 PM, we need a good crew of volunteers to help with tear down. We remove the exhibits from the frames and disassemble the frames for shipment back to the storage facility. We also pack up the Beginners' Booth for storage.

Denise Stotts Awarded APS Luff Award

Each year the American Philatelic Society (APS) recognizes three individuals as recipients of the Luff Award. This is the highest award that a philatelist can win in the United States. The three areas of recognition are for Distinguished Philatelic Research, Outstanding Service to the APS and Exceptional Contributions to Philately.

Denise has been recognized as the 2018 recipient for Exceptional Contributions to Philately. John Barwis of Michigan (and a former HPS member) will receive the 2018 Research award and Wayne Youngblood of Wisconsin will receive the 2018 Service to the APS award.

All three winners will be formally recognized at the APS Stampshow Celebration Banquet at StampShow in Columbus, Ohio in August. They will sign the prestigious Luff Scroll and receive commemorative rings.

In their press release, the APS stated "Stotts has been an active and tireless philatelic leader and volunteer at the national, state and local level for more than 25 years."

Locally, Denise's 23 year run as our Greater Houston Show Chair has produced a solid foundation for our annual show. She forged the original relationship with our venue, the Humble Civic Center and still serves in other show activities such as Banquet Chair.

She was always willing to be the face of a philatelic organization and frequently manned the registration counter at APS Stampshow and society booths at major shows such as those of AAPE and USSS.

The necessary information must be submitted to TPA Secretary/Treasurer Darryl Metting, PO Box 285, Shiner TX 77984-0285, or by email to his attention at <u>ihred65@yahoo.com</u> by **Oct. 1, 2018**. *Voting will conclude on Dec. 15, 2018*.

The Directors elected will choose a President and Vice President from among themselves. Those who hold the appointed positions of Secretary/Treasurer, *Journal* Editor or Website Coordinator may elect to run for the Board if they wish to have a vote but they do not have to. A list of candidates and their biographies will appear in the November issue of the *Journal of Texas Philately & Postal History*. Again, the deadline for the receipt of votes for all candidates is Dec. 15, 2018.

Madame Chiang Kai-shek, Artist

Chiang Kai-shek (1887-1975), military and political leader of the Republic of China from 1928 to 1975, had an extremely talented wife.

Madame Chiang (1898-2003) was an artist specializing in flowers and landscapes. Critics have compared her work to ancient Chinese masters from 2,000 years earlier.

Several of her works appeared on Republic of China stamps through the years. Examples are from 1975 (Scott 1960-63), 1977 (2038-41) and 1987 (2577-80).
