GHSS Single Frame Exhibit Color for 2015:

Green

A high point of the Single Frame Brown Stamp competition was the exhibit entry by professional postal history dealer Labron Harris. Although he has been a long-time dealer, selling postal history throughout the country with his wife, Mary, his entry in GHSS 2014 was a rare occurrence. Most national level dealers probably "collect" one or two specialties, but seldom, have any of them entered an exhibit in competition. In this case, the allure of the single frame structure and the Brown Color Competition brought out the exhibitor in Labron and he did a fantastic job as a novice, earning a Vermeil Medal and the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors Novice Award for his exhibit, *International Usages of the 5¢ Brown Small Banknote*.

In 2010, our own Jonathan Topper did the same, as a postal history dealer, he put together his first ever exhibit, a Single Frame Orange stamp exhibit, 8¢ Orange Winged Globe Air Mail in the Depression Era. So our GHSS Single Frame Color competition has attracted two first-time exhibitor dealers.

That brings us to the color for next year. At the Awards Dinner, GHSS 2014 Chief Judge Phil Stager of Florida drew a green crayon from the sacred tin which means that at GHSS 2015, we will host a Single Frame Green competition. On Sunday, another nationally prominent postal history dealer, Doug Weisz of Pennsylvania put out the word that he intended to follow Jonathan and Labron's leads and enter an exhibit in the GHSS 2015 Single Frame exhibit competition. His subject will be the 1¢ Pilgrim Tercentenary commemorative stamp of 1920.

The HPS couldn't resist the temptation to promote the concept of a dealer's exhibit challenge within the framework of the Single Frame Green stamp competition, so on Sunday afternoon we spread the word to the dealers at our show - prepare and exhibit a Single Frame Green stamp exhibit at GHSS 2015. And there's no reason to limit it to GHSS dealers. How about helping us spreading the word when you travel to shows around the country? Tell your dealer acquaintances about the single frame exhibit competition.

Will Michael Ball of A to Z Stamps produce a Green Stamp exhibit? Or how about our own Jonathan Topper with an encore? And Labron? Terry Kurzinski is a known collector of the 1903 Louisiana Purchase issue on cover. How about a postal history of the 1¢ Livingston stamp of that series from Terry?

Two of our 2014 judges, Paul Goodwin and Jeff Shapiro, former members of the original national exhibiting team. The Bittersweets, are members of a new team, Unhinged. Our own HPS exhibiting team, The Midnight Mavericks faced The Bittersweets twice before at team competitions in Indianapolis and Denver and those were fun filled weekends. Members of both Unhinged and The Midnight Mavericks held preliminary discussions about both teams having a competition at GHSS 2015 that would contain a mix of both multi-frame exhibits and Single Frame Green Stamp exhibits from both teams. Ron Strawser will represent The Midnight Mavericks in negotiations with Unhinged. Expect us to pull out all the stops for this competition. We'll keep you updated at upcoming HPS meetings and in the pages of The Perforator.

GHSS 2015 has the makings of being one of the most memorable exhibit competitions in the country next year.

Speaking of exhibit competitions TEXPEX 2015 is hosting its Great Texas Shootout at their show in Grapevine in February. The Shootout is a competition between various Texas and Oklahoma clubs whereby each club will have, within their frame, 15 individual Single Page exhibits and a cover page. This is a unique opportunity for many club members to produce their very first exhibit. Details of the judging, etc., are still in the works, but a champion will be crowned and the TEXPEX committee has promised a special Grand Prize.

HPS vice-president and TPA president John Germann is the coordinator for the HPS team and he now has a roster of 15 HPS volunteers to make single page exhibits. John formed our team and covered the topic at the last several HPS meetings.

Ron Strawser Captures GHSS 2014 Grand Award

Ron Strawser's International Gold Medal winning exhibit of *Postal Cards from the Belgian Congo* added another prize to it's resume, the Grand Award at GHSS 2014. Strawser also won another Gold Medal and the United States Stamp Society's President's Award for his national Gold Medal winning exhibit, *Postal History* of the United States Famous American Issues.

Larry Ballantyne debuted a stunning new exhibit, Postal History of the Canadian "War Issue" of 1942 to 1949. He won the BNAPS Award and a Gold Medal.

Bryant Korn, a first-time exhibitor just a year ago at GHSS 2013, showed three exhibits this year, two stemming from his specialized Liberia Collection and a single frame Brown exhibit featuring the 1847 5¢ issues on cover from Ohio. All three exhibits won Gold Medals.

William Drummond premiered his *Flying Buffaloes* exhibit in the single frame competition. This exhibit was a companion piece to William's multi-part articles on the same subject currently being published in the *Airpost Journal* of the American Air Mail Society.

David Willig signed the coveted *Scroll of Many Colors* at the Awards Dinner for winning the Best Single Frame Brown Stamp Exhibit for his showing of *U.S. 19th Century Brown Postal Markings. Are They Brown or Something Else?* For the HPS, it was especially gratifying for David to sign *The Scroll* because he is a co-founder of the Single Frame Color Competition. As this year's winner, he also collected a dollar from Jay Stotts and the Barry's Challenge.

Stotts swept the TSDA and NSDA awards for the Most Popular Multi-Frame exhibit (*The 1914 Summer Tours of the C&B Line*) and the Most Popular Single Frame exhibit (*A Natural History of the White Rhinoceros*). His *C&B Tours* exhibit won the Reserve Grand Award and the *White Rhino* exhibit was the American Topical Association winner.

Nationally prominent philatelic exhibitors captured the top two Single Frame awards. John Hotchner of Virginia won the Single Frame Grand with *The Mid-19th Century Start of Perforating in Great Britain and the United States*. Timothy Bartshe of Colorado won the Reserve Grand with Orange Free State 1 Shilling Brown of 1896. Dr. Edwin Andrews of North Carolina was awarded the APS Certificate of Merit for *Design and Production of the 5¢ Garfield Memorial Stamp of 1882*.

We would like to express our thanks and congratulations to all the GHSS exhibitors.
